

OAA Administrative Structure



Advancing Access to Justice & Safety Net Programs

- When legal services are available they can be life saving, but many do not access legal help
 - Do not realize their problem has a legal solution
 - Unaware that they may be eligible for help
- Aging services & supportive services often are front line providers
 - Issue spotting
 - Holistic and key for ongoing independence

History of Partnership

- Aging Services has had a contract with LSND for over 30 years
- Contract spells out target areas for focus
- VAPS and LSND have worked cooperatively for the past 8 years

Central Intake

- VAPS Central Intake
 - Available Monday through Friday 8 am to 5 pm
 - Online reporting 24/7
 - 2,285 reports in FFY18
- LSND Central Intake (60+)
 - Available Monday through Thursday 8 am to 5 pm and Friday from 8 am to 2 pm
 - Online application 24/7
 - 1752 applications in FFY2018



Aging & Disability Resource Link (ADRL)

- Available Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm
- 2,790 calls in the last biennium
- Top information requests include:
 - In-home assistance
 - Medicaid information
 - APS
 - Ombudsman referrals
 - Options counseling



Cross Training

- Staff from both offices have received training on programs/services offered
 - Discussion on who can do what
 - Discussion on how certain situations can be handled
 - Contacts at both agencies to
- Both agencies aware of reporting procedures
- Increases access and knowledge



Cross Reporting

- Both entities engage in cross reporting
- Provides comprehensive coverage for seniors/vulnerable adults statewide
- Partnership and senior network decreases chances of older adults with needs falling through the cracks



Open Communication

- Staff from both entities able to reach out for assistance and staffing
 - Provides consistent and cooperative services for the vulnerable adults
- Both agencies provide outreach and education statewide
 - Professionals
 - Older adults



Case Examples

- Guardianship matters
 - LSND can represent seniors in resisting guardianship or acting as GAL
- Consumer matters
 - Educating small town banks on Social Security protections
 - Bankruptcy for older adults with old medical debt
- Medicaid eligibility matters
 - Older adult having been financially exploited is denied Medicaid due to a disqualifying transfer
